## CHILD PROTECTION CAMPAIGN

The City of Francistown Council, embarked on a vital Child Protection Campaign, aimed at raising awareness and strengthening community responsibility in safeguarding the rights and well-being of children.

On the 5th August 2025, the campaign took to the Francistown Taxi Rank led by His Worship the Mayor, Hon. Gaone Majere. Members of the Taxi Association (Taxi & Mini bus operators) were engaged on child protection issues, as they are protagonists with regards to protecting the safety of children and as stakeholders in children's welfare both at work and at home.



The Taxi Association was further informed that they should view all children they come across as their own and should do the needful as and when necessary, to reduce child abuse and child negligence cases amongst others.

It must be hastened that children in our communities continue to face risks such as abuse, neglect, exploitation, and harmful social practices, though Botswana has made significant strides in child protection legislation and policies, practical challenges still hinder the full realization of these rights at grassroots level.

The campaign seeks to engage various stakeholders including parents, caregivers, schools, law enforcement, business community and young people themselves to promote a culture of child safety and care by creating a more responsive and protective community environment.

The Child Protection Campaign commenced on 1st April 2025 and scheduled to end on the 29th August 2025.





#### MAYOR ENGAGES WARD DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEES

On the 9th August 2025, His Worship the Mayor Hon. Gaone Majere, had a meet and greet session with all 25 Ward Development Committees (WDCs).

Amongst others topics pondered on were;

- 1) Mayor's 5 Year Road Map.
- 2) The need for WDCs to spearhead debt collection in the City.
- 3) Need for WDCs to engage the community thoroughly on Clean Ups, to ensure a Clean City in alignment with Sustainable Development Goals.
- 4) The need for WDCs to fully exercise their liberty, to monitor projects in their wards and swiftly sensitizing Council of any challenges/issues as per their viewpoint.
- 5) WDCs must exercise their authority in their respective wards, to combat drug and alcohol abuse.
- 6) WDC members urged to desist from active politics when pursuing WDC errands, as per Public Service Act.
- 7) Lastly but not least, to strengthen the relationship between Council and WDCs.





# MAYOR ENGAGES MANAGEMENT OF JUNIOR SECONDARY SCHOOLS

On the 12<sup>th</sup> August 2025, His Worship the Mayor of Francistown, Hon. Gaone Majere, commenced a 3-days tour of all the seven Francistown Junior Secondary Schools.

The tour commenced at Goldmine Junior Secondary School, followed by Montsamaisa Junior Secondary School then Selepa Junior Secondary School.

The main objective of this visit, was for the Mayor to 'meet and greet', as well as to engage with the school senior management, hence offering support to the schools.

The tour continued to the 13th August 2025, at Donga Junior Secondary School, Setlalekgosi Junior Secondary School and Mmei Junior Secondary School. On the 14th August 2025, the Mayor completed his tour by visiting Selolwe Junior Secondary School and Tadabigwa Junior Secondary School.

Last week, the Umbrella Clean Ups were carried out at Masego Ward, this week is scheduled for Monarch Ward and the week after, the clean up campaign will be wrapped up at Gerald Estates.

## RECONSTRUCTION OF FRANCISTOWN EDUCATION PARK

The Minister of Environment and Tourism, Hon. Wynter Boipuso Mmolotsi visited the Francistown Education Park on the 27th August 2025, to physically appreciate the project status quo, as well as to receive a comprehensive report on the progress of the project.

One million pula has been transferred from the Department of Wildlife and National Parks (DWNP), to the City of Francistown Council (COFC), to facilitate the implementation of the reconstruction of Francistown Education Park, which is located along Gerald Estates-Shashemooke road.

The project was scheduled to be completed on the 30th August 2025, however this has been revised to be 30th December 2025.

The main purpose of reconstruction of the park, is to stock small game (wildlife), to provide an educational facility school excursions, as well as creating recreational activities for the general public and tourists at a fee.

The COFC is reconstructing the park through artisans. The reconstruction includes;

- \*Erection of a new boundary fencing.
- \*Construction of guard house at the main gate.
- \*Construction of office and two chalets.
- \*Creation of game drive routes.







## BOTSWANA COUNSELLING ASSOCIATION DONATES TO FLOOD VICTIMS



On the 28th August 2025, the City of Francistown Council received a warm donation of P7, 000.00, from the Botswana Counselling Association (BCA).

The aim of the donation was for Council to hand it over to two Zimbabwean families, that tragically lost their children in the last flood disaster. Each family was issued P3, 500.00.



COFC's Deputy Town Clerk -Operations, Ms Pedzani Selwana-Mahama, denoted that after the flood disaster, council realized that the support from Non-government Organisations(NGOs) is a necessity, therefore appreciating BCA for their generosity. She added that their contribution will go a long way because the donation coupled by the psychosocial support service which will be rendred to the families by the BCA, will help them to cope with the trauma and enable them to rebuild their lives since healing is a process.

The BCA is a beacon of psychosocial support in Botswana as it is an organization dedicated to the professional development of counselling practice.
